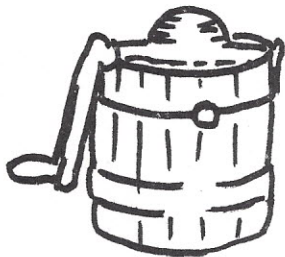

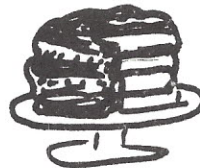

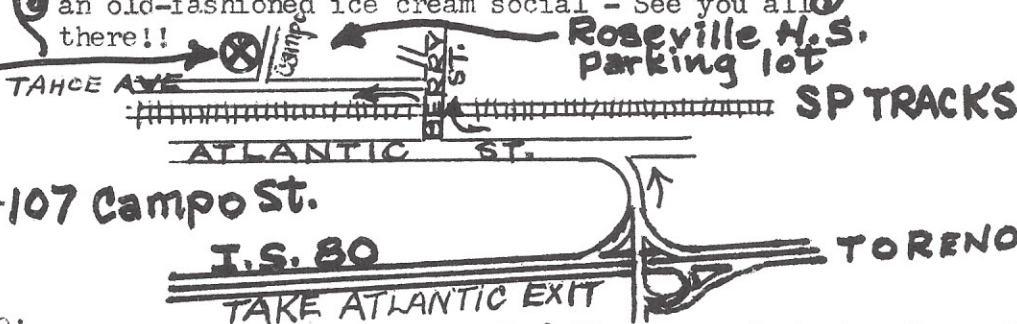
STOP THE PRESSES! WHOA! BACK UP! LOOK HERE!

BLEKINGE (eastern)
Plain skirt, patterned apron, full sleeves and embroidered wide collar, Klut cover chief rather than cap. Any stripes are perpendicular.



HALLAND (Fjäre)
Skirts and aprons vary richly in pattern and color. Sleeves of blouse often embroidered. Bodice usually peplumed. Embroidered or frame cap. Silk caps with lace edging over face.



NORRLAND (Skellefteå)
Skirt basic black with narrow red stripes, or plain and pleated. Dark striped aprons often half wool or cotton. Bodice usually overlapped hooking and red in color. Kerchief checkered or plaid. Blouse white linen. Framed cap, very small.
