CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE By Bernie Lundberg

First I wish to thank Don Johnson for his terrific leadership as Monitor's Chairman in 1982. We appreciate your talent and efforts on our behalf.

Now I wish to thank the lodge members for electing me as your chairman for 1983. I shall strive to be the leader you want and hope to keep Monitor Lodge progressing in the true Vasa spirit.

We held a "kick-off" potluck dinner for new officers at our home on January 15. My thanks to Muriel Hjersman, District Deputy for conducting the officers training session and to all the officers who attended. It was very informative and enlightened us on lodge needs.

The membership has grown, and the attendance at meetings has increased the past year and my desire is for more members to become active this year.

The coming years activities are outlined in the Program Book and all the officers and myself hope they fit the schedule of our brothers and sisters of Monitor, local and District lodges.

Sweden and France had close relations during the American Revolutionary War and many Swedish officers served with the French forces aiding the American Colonies. The most distinguished of these was Count Axel von Fersen who arrived in America in 1780 as adjutant to the French General Rochambeau.

As adjutant he arranged the negotiations between Washington and Rochambeau in which Lafayette served as interpreter. Fersen formed great admiration for Washington whom he described in a letter to his family as the "most illustrious man of the age." Fersen distinguished himself at the battle of Yorktown in 1781.

Following this service he returned to France where he became a favorite of Marie Antoinette. He was recalled to Sweden for diplomatic and military missions but was returned to France where he attempted the rescue of Marie Antoinette from the French Revolution. (In the 1930's motion picture "Marie Antoinette" the part of Fersen was played by Fredric March).

Fersen returned to Sweden, served in many important posts and met a most tragic death in Stockholm in 1810.
