## GUSTAV II ADOLF (continued) Count Axel Oxenstierna

The reign of Gustav II Adolf and the following years were a period of great reform and reorganization of the government of Sweden. That this was accomplished in spite of Sweden's involvement in the Thirty Years war and the death of Gustav in 1632 was due in very large part to the ability and efforts of the remarkable statesman, Axel Oxenstierna.

When Gustav negotiated with the nobles to be crowned before his majority the nobles imposed a condition that Oxenstierna be named as Chancellor. Gustav and Oxenstierna developed and affection as well as a close working relationship. Oxenstierna served in many administrative, diplomatic and parliamentary assignments and shares the credit for the achievements of the reign.

Upon the death of Gustav he became the virtual ruler of Sweden as regent. Gustav's heir, the future Queen Kristina was only six years old. Oxenstierna directed the conduct of the remaining years of the Thirty Years War and negotiated with the other parties as an equal.

When Kristina attained majority and became the queen relations became strained for some years but Oxenstierna was restored to favor in 1650 until his death in 1654.

Oxenstierna has been described as sagacious, imperturbable, courageous and industrious. He was entirely devoted to the interests of Sweden.
