

THE FLOWER KING (continued)

In 1736 Linnaeus was ready to complete his medical studies. That meant he had to receive a degree from a foreign university since the Swedes had little confidence in Uppsala or Lund.

Linnaeus had already published articles on botany. He wrote in Latin which was the universal scientific language of the time. He also spoke Latin fluently so he could converse with learned men in many
countries. When he went to Germany on his way to
the college of Harderwijk in Holland, he found his
name was known among the educated people of Lubeck
and Hamburg.

At Harderwijk he was awarded his degree after one week of examinations. He then went to the great university at Leyden. Almost immediately he came to the attention of learned scholars and the rich amateur botanists who had made fortunes in the East India trade and who had botanical gardens filled with the strange new plants brought by their captains and traders.

He was offered honor and money to remain and work for them. However, he was engaged to be married to Sara Lisa Moraeus, daughter of a learned and wealthy physician. The father had given Linnaeus two years to establish himself before marriage could be considered. Linnaeus devoted those years to study in Holland, France, and England and wrote many works about the new plant wonders he had classified and identified. He was also offered honored positions in England and France and even in Spain which he had not visited. He refused all of these to return to Sweden to claim his bride.
