

After our summer recess we resumed our regular meetings with a very full agenda. We voted on new members, initiated new members, had reports from the Grand Lodge convention and had the sad duty of draping our charter in memory of Hilma Tvede. Since we have received a number of new members it may be appropriate to review the significance of the names of our order and lodge.
"Vasa" memorializes the name of Gustaf Vasa who led the revolt against Denmark in 1520, restored Sweden's independence and became King of Sweden in 1523. The Vasa dynasty endured for almost 300 years. "Monitor" was the name of the ironclad warship built by the Swedish-American inventor John Ericsson which made an important contribution to the Union cause in the Civil War. The hull was low in the water to present a poor target and the revolving turret made it very effective. The ship is pictured on the masthead of this newsletter.

Adolphus Frederick of Oldenburg-Holstein-Gottorp became king. His connection to the Vasa lineage was very distant. His reign marks a low tide in the affairs of Sweden. Sweden had lost her position as the great power of the North but was still a pivotal factor.

Foreign powers attempted to influence aff-airs by subsidies; Russia, Denmark and England on one side as opposed to France. Because of French influence Sweden was let in for war in 1757 against Frederick II of Prussia on the side of France and Austria. The war was badly handled but peace was made in 1762 without loss of territory.

During this period the king had little power and the two opposing parties, the Hats and the caps dominated the leadership. Both of the parties received subsidies from the foreign powers and corruption was rampant.

This is a most difficult period of Swedish history to understand and to write. The Hats were the party who wanted to restore the former power and influence of Sweden. They were supported by the French. The caps were more realistic and accepted the status quo. Naturally this was most acceptable to Russia and Denmark and they subsidized the party.

Adolphus Frederick died in 1771. His son succeeded as Gustaf III and there were some very different developments.



Honorees are Former U.S. Ambassador to Sweden Franklin Forsberg and Gwedish author Astrid Lindgren. This event takes place every two years; 1980 in Minneapolis, 1982 in New York, and 1984 in Seattle. PROGRAM BOOK FOR 1987 PREPARATION. Be sure to check your name, address, and telephone number on the list at the next meeting. We want it to be correct in the Program Book. Also, in October is election of officers and voting for the proposed program and some of the activities for 1987 that go into the Program Book. Be there and do your part, please!



- DL Merger ceremony of two or more LL's must be used when merger takes place.
- DL/LL Vasa Star will list Vasa Parks throughout the country in the listing of district and local lodges, etc.
- DL/LL All lodges be encouraged to buy and display the other four Scandinavian flags. (Denmark Finland Iceland Norway)
- LL That the Local Lodge pass-word be issued ONCE EVERY FOUR YEARS in January following the GL Convention by the Grand Master.
- LL A minimum of nine regular meetings every year with socials in the vacant months.

  Of the nine, other meetings may be cancelled provided members have sufficient and timely notice of such decision by the lodge.
- LL In USA/Canada Local Lodge Ritual insert "REACH SWEDEN" "KONTAKT SVERIGE" or in Agenda of Local Lodge Meeting.
- DL/LL Redesigning of membership application to include other family members and application will probably be an  $8\frac{1}{2}x11$  sheet.
- DL/LL Vasa Archives to be renamed Vasa Order of America National Archives, Inc.
  - LL When Chairman gives welcome speech to newly initiated members he shall add "and a Membership Kit will be sent to you from the GI: Membership Chairman."

# MOTIONS PASSED AT GL CONVENTION IMMEDIATELY AFFECTING DISTRICT AND LOCAL LODGES

- DL Passive members shall have the right of attendance and speech at district meetings BUT NO VOTE.
- LL The GL will allow up to \$200 of reimbursable expenses to organizer(s) of new LL.
- LL Student loans from Scholarship Fund are available to candidates who have been Vasamembers for TWO YEARS.
- LL Dual members are eligible to be delegates to the District Lodge from EITHER OF LOCAL LODGES to which member belongs.
- LL Members may hold membership in NOT MORE THAN TWO LOCAL LODGES of the Order.

Dual member may serve as an elected officer in one LL only during calendar year.

Each LL shall provide an accurate account of all dual members in the LL to the Grand Secretary.

Member seeking dual membership must present a statement from present LL showing "good standing", attested to by the Financial Secretary.

- DL Institution of new LL The DL or its Executive Board, in conjunction with elected officers of the new LL shall arrange for time and place of institution.
- DL/LL The Vasa Order Emblem may NOT BE USED on any manufactured item without the consent of the GL Executive Board.
- DL District Secretary shall maintain a file of individual gold impressions of every LL Seal of lodges under jurisdiction of the district.
- DL/LL Upon dissolution of a chartered Vasa Activities Club, the retired charter shall be returned to the Grand Secretary. Any remaining funds must be turned over to the District Lodge.

At least one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  of all members in a Vasa Activities Club shall be Vasa-members.

All officers must be Vasa-members.

- DL/LL GL Per Capita Tax increased by 75 cents per member/per year. Due and payable December 31, 1986.
- DL/LL Delete reference to salute for member entering or leaving lodge room, and it shall be the duty of the Inner Guard to verify membership and seat late arrivals.

Delete salute during initiation ceremony when saying "Welcome"

- DL New installation ceremony for District Trustee/Auditors; District Cultural Leader; District Historian and (optional) for District Deputies.
- LL New installation ceremony for Local Lodge Historian.
- LL All property of disbanded LL shall become the property of the district, except the LL Charter, record books and three imprints of the LL Seal, which shall become the property of the GL and be forwarded to the Vasa National Archives for safe-keeping.
- DL/LL Mandatory use of a Membership Card (available from GL soon)
