### GUSTAV III 1771-1792

King Adolf Frederick died in 1771. The crown prince, Gustav now became king. He was in Paris at the time of his father's death but returned to Sweden with all speed.

Adolf Frederick never had any power as king. He was an outsider with only a very distant Vasa lineage and had been imposed on Sweden by Catherine of Russia. The royal council reqisitioned his signature seal so his name appeared on royal decrees in which he had no involvement.

His Prussian Queen, Louisa Ulrika, sister to Frederick of Prussia had her own ideas of rulership. She attempted some court intrigues to increase the royal power but these were unsuccessful. She then spent her attention on the upbringing of the crown prince.

She was passionately devoted to the arts and Gustav received a very thorough artistic education. This interest extended throughout his life. She also imbued him with her ideas of how a king should rule.

The new King Gustav apparently had laid plans. He attempted to reconcile the ruling faction but then resorted to direct action. His agents had prepared uprisings in Finland and Skane to support more royal power. These were delayed by poor communication so on August 19, 1772 he directed the Royal Guard to arrest the members of the ruling council. The Riksdag (Parliament) was summoned and approved a new constitution restoring much of the royal power.
