GUSTAV IV

Note-I began these items on Swedish history and culture a short time after I became a member of Monitor Lodge and found that some of our members did not know the significance of the name of our oder and lodge. I began with some items on Gustav Vasa. I have continued writing these because history is one of my interests and Swedish history is fascinating.

Many of our members tell me they enjoy these items and I plan to continue preparing them. The principal difficulty is condensing complex history into a short article. It has been my hope that these items will lead our members into some research of their own. There are some books on Swedish history available through the public libraries and there are excellent summaries in the Enclyclopedia Britannica.

The dramatic assassination of Gustav III was the subject of a number of books. Verdi planned to use one of these for the text of his opera "A Masked Ball". He was warned that the subject was dangerous and might lead to censorship since there had been an attempted royal assassination a short time earlier. He shifted the locale and characters so the opera story makes little sense.

When I began these articles I wrote that the history of Sweden is not only long but complex and involves many other countries and events beyond Sweden's borders. The Reformation, the quarrels between German principalities, the politics of Poland, the growing power of Russia under Peter the Great, the disputes between Russia and Turkey, all played a part. The French Revolution and Napoleonic Wars affected the reign of Gustav IV who succeeded to the throne in 1792 at the age of 13.


1987 Camellia Festival is
