

ENGELBREKT - A great man who was small of stature

That is the way Vilhelm Moberg heads his chapter on Engelbrekt in his Swedish history. Engelbrekt Engelbrektsson is a great and famous man in Swedish history about whom very little is known.

Moberg states there are more statues of Engelbrekt in Sweden than any of Sweden's kings. This is in spite of the fact that no one knows how he looked. Of course statues are usually of heroic size. But the few contemporary accounts of Engelbrekt make a point that he was very small in stature. Men in the Middle Ages were generally much smaller than now. Suits of armor from that period and examination of skeletons bear this out. That special mention is made of Engelbrekt's stature must indicate that he was much smaller than the average. Popular heroes are usually tall, Engelbrekt is an exception.

In the year 1434, Engelbrekt became the leader of a popular revolt in Sweden. Within a year he was the real ruler of Sweden and elected "Captain-General in Sweden" at a council meeting in January 1435 at Arboga.

The background of Engelbrekt's revolt goes back several years. In 1387 Margaret of Denmark had been elected queen of Sweden. She was already ruler of Denmark and Norway. She ruled until her death in 1412. She had no surviving children and made her grand nephew, Eric of Pomerania, her heir in all three kingdoms. Eric made his headquarters in Denmark and seemed to regard Sweden and Norway as colonies to be exploited for taxes to support his wars against the Hanseatic League. He required his Swedish subjects to pay taxes in cash; that meant the royal tax collectors could place their own value on the grain, butter and meat the peasants had previously furnished and taxes became more burdensome. Resolved: that Article 17 (a) - District General Fund - be amended to read: "The District General Fund shall receive its income from a \$6.70 (\$3.70) per capita tax, plus any assessments levied by the Grand Lodge, to be paid yearly be the local lodges at the close of the term. All surplus funds received from festivals and other affairs under the auspices of the District Lodge shall be paid into the District General Fund unless otherwise directed." Motivation: Additional funding is needed to meet rising operating expenses and would enable the District Lodge to promote support programs and growth opportunities for local lodges.
