ENGELBREKT - (Conclusion) The death of Engelbrekt

Engelbrekt did not attempt to overthrow Eric of Pomerania. He apparently only wished reprieve from the burdensome taxes. He was one of the signers of an agreement with Eric who then left Sweden for Denmark. The real government of Sweden became a council of Swedish nobles.

The military campaigns had affected Engelbrekt physically. He suffered from rheumatism or arthritis and could not walk without crutches. He had been given the province of Närke and retired there to Orebro castle. In April 1436, there was a meeting of the council in Stockholm for more negotiation with Eric. As Captain-General of Sweden, Engelbrekt had to attend.

He could not ride a horse so he had to travel by boat. On April 27, 1436, Engelbrekt's party stopped to spend the night on an island in Lake Hjälmaren. He was joined by a party with Mans Bengtsson of the noble Natt och Dag family. Engelbrekt had been at emnity with the family but differences had been reconciled. He welcomed Mans Bengtsson who immediately struck him with his broad axe. The crippled Engelbrekt tried to flee but his assailant split his head with his broad axe and his men shot the corpse with arrows. This was witnessed by his wife and family.

We know more about the death of Engelbrekt than most of his life. There were witnesses and Engelbrekt's death became the subject of epic poems. His burial place became a shrine and he was regarded almost as a saint in Sweden until the Protestant Reformation.

This occurred over 450 years ago and we do not know and can never know the motive for this treacherous and brutal murder. Everyone knew the identity of Mans Bengtsson but he was placed under protection by the Earl Marshal of Sweden, Karl Knutsson Bonde. Karl Knutsson may have had his own reasons for eliminating his most important rival. He consolidated his power and was elected King of Sweden in 1448.
