

### **Best in Europe**

Mail services in Sweden, Denmark, and Finland are the best in Europe, according to a survey done by Price Waterhouse.

The agency mailed 1.3 million letters to places all over Europe to check how the mail services live up to their goal of delivering international mail within three days. 69.1 percent of the mail made it on time.

Sweden and Finland are the two countries where deliveries are most likely to arrive within the three days. Denmark is best with outgoing mail.

Companies in Finland, Denmark, and Sweden are also best at paying their bills of all European countries. Finnish companies pay their bills after 24 days on average, Danish companies in 35 days, and Swedish companies in 37 days.



#### Curb on Salaries

Sweden and Finland are urging the European Commission to clamp down on high salaries paid to commission officials, reportedly earning up to 1.3 million Swedish kronor a year.

The Prime Minister in Sweden earns 780,000 kronor a year.


