Condensed Minutes from 6 March General Meeting

 Fourteen candidates for membership were approved and 10 were present to be initiated. Two Vasa members transferred from another lodge.
February 10 minutes were approved as published in the newsletter.

3. The Scholarship Committee was tasked with writing a formal proposal on age limits for Monitor scholarships to be effective 1999.

4. The following members will be delegates to the District Convention in April: Art Niemoller, Don and Joy Carlson, and David and Dee Benson. Gail Nemy and Ingrid Kennedy are alternates. As of this year, the District increased the number of delegates that Monitor can send from four to five.

The girls' families will be glad to host a girl from California in exchange. This is a great opportunity for young people to get acquainted with a new family and learn about a different culture.


