Deadlines are approaching for applications for various scholarships. First, there is

our Monitor Lodge scholarship in the amount of \$500, which will be awarded to a graduating high school senior planning to attend college or vocational school next fall. Either the applicant or the applicant's parent or grandparent must be a member of Monitor Lodge. About Our Order

The Vasa Order of America began in 1896 as a benefit society for Swedish immigrants to the United States. Membership was limited to Swedish-born men who, through the Vasa Order, met others who needed to learn the new language and ways of the new country. A benefit fund provided a small income during sickness and a death benefit helped cover final expenses. The Order is names for Gustav Vasa, who liberated the country in the 16th century and became the first King of modern Sweden. The name Vasa reflects the Order's roots as a Swedish-American

Fraternal Organization.

Over the decades, many things changed and the Order has grown to meet new needs. Where in the past, members looked to the Vasa Order to help them learn the ways of a new country and provide them a means to share problems and solutions, today, the Order provides members a means to share their rich heritage with fellow Americans and helps them learn or remember the meaningful ways and values of the "Old Country."

The Vasa Order of America now welcomes men and women over 14 year of age with Scandinavian roots and their spouses who would like to rediscover the traditions of their ancestors and share their Scandinavian heritage. We do this by encouraging the observance of special dates such as Midsummer and Lucia with proper festivities including smörgåsbord and Scandinavian music. Many lodges and districts sponsor language classes as well as children's clubs.

There are nearly three hundred lodges in the Vasa Order, governed by 19 district lodges in the United States. Sweden, and Canada.

KEYBOARD - Vhere ya suppose to put da keys so da Missus can find em.


SOFTWARE - Da plastic picnic utinsils, ya?
