


English:


November Cultural Program

The Family History Center is owned and operated by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and opens at 10:00 a.m. Tuesday through Friday. The Center is located 2745 Eastern Avenue between Marconi and El Camino.

The Center has over 18,000 volumes in its book collection and over 20,000 of microfiche records. Volunteer staff members will assist patrons in their genealogical research. The use of the Center is open to members of all religions. Approximately 80% of the Center's patrons are NOT members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

The Sacramento Center is the 7th largest of its kind and is the largest in this area. The center has a staff of over one hundred volunteer librarians who maintain the library, handle check-in and check-out of microfilm and arrange for inter-library loans of microfilm, as well as assisting patrons in doing basic genealogical research.
