We are resurrecting the "Member of the Month" with this edition of the newsletter and to kick things off, here is a brief background note about your newest chairman, Chuck Johnson. He was born in New Hampshire in 1950. In 1954 he and his family moved to Madrid, Spain as part of the first group of American families to be allowed to live in Spain under the defense treaty signed by Franco. He lived in Spain for 10 years, becoming fluently bilingual, before being transferred to Goose Air Base in Labrador (the basis for a book titled "The Land God Gave to Cain") where he learned to ski, got his driver's license and shoveled tons of liquid sunshine. In 1966 he left his family behind to spend his last two years of high school at The Governor's Academy north of Boston, founded in 1763 (school seal made by Paul Revere). He then moved on to attend the University of Rochester in upstate New York where he met his first Swede, and future wife, Chris Bodelson. Graduating with a degree in geology and his commission in the Navy, he served on active duty for three years, experiencing a number of adventures throughout the Pacific, including helping evacuate Saigon in early 1975. He then returned to Rochester and worked several different short term jobs while Chris returned to college to get her BSN. Then a move back to New Hampshire to attend graduate school while Chris worked as an RN at the Portsmouth Hospital. In 1979, MS in hand and Mrs. in tow (well, car #2), a cross country trip ensued, ending in Gallup, New Mexico where Chuck spent a year performing soil surveys on the Navajo and Hopi Indian Reservations. While professionally a great job, the living conditions were not where he and Chris wanted to raise their new born son Brian so he started looking around and managed to land a soil scientist position with the Bureau of Reclamation in Sacramento. So, twelve months after arriving in Gallup, the cars were packed up again for the drive to Sacramento in the summer of 1980. Thirty five years later he retired from Reclamation, having spent his last 15 years as the Regional Land Manager. Along the way he coached Brian's soccer team, served as his Cub Scout Den leader and later his Scoutmaster, spent many years refereeing youth soccer, working as a regional Problem Captain for Odyssey of the Mind (he is looking for judges for the March 11, 2017 regional tournament) and celebrated his 25^{th} anniversary as a member of Monitor Lodge in May 2016. When he isn't otherwise occupied or doing something with his wife of 42 years (and counting) like visiting Seattle and the grandkids, attending B Street Theater or Sacramento Choral Society performances, checking out art galleries and antique malls he is puttering around the house working on woodworking projects or in the garden.
