I will always remember these visits and cherish my memories of these places.

Believe it or not, my favorite place was in Skåne near my grandfather's town of Bjärsjölagård and the walk to visit my family's grave sites at the church in Östra Kärrstorp (2 miles down the road). Stopping at the top of the hill between the two towns and seeing all the beautiful farmland as far as the eye could see was just amazing."
