Member of the Month. This month we are featuring **Brian Horsfield.** Brian has had a fascinating Swedish language journey, so in his own words:

"My first visit to Sweden was in 1977 when I went to learn more about how cars and trucks were fueled with wood during WWII. I visited Statens Maskinprovningar (THE SWEDISH MACHINERY TESTING INSTITUTE) where they had trucks and tractors under test. That visit took me to Uppsala and Umeå.

My second visit and the start of my Swedish language adventure started in the early 80's when I started doing business with a small company in Norrland, specifically in Malå



which is northwest of Skellefteå. This was a small company that made and sold logging equipment and they were going to make a special felling head for Weyerhaeuser. When I first met with them it was clear that the Managing Director (Verkstallande Direktör, VD) did not speak English so all discussions were conducted thru their consultant. After we had been doing business for about 6 months the VD called me and, in broken English explained that he had fired the consultant and said "I hope you trust me." His effort

to learn English inspired me to try to learn Swedish so I convinced my boss to let me go to Berlitz. This lasted for about 4 months until my boss tired of it. I thought that I was making progress and wanted to continue. I was fortunate that I found a Swedish exchange student who would help me.

I was able to find exchange students almost every year since then so I slowly improved. All along I felt that it was important to live in Sweden for a while in order to get better so I promised myself that when I retired I would make the effort. So in 2009 we went to Skåne and lived in Simrishamn for 4 months during which I commuted to school in Lund to continue my Swedish studies. During that 4 month visit we took a driving trip up the east coast as far a Skellefteå then turned inland and took the Inland Highway (inlandsvägen, E46) thru Ostersund and Mora).

In 2010 we returned for a 3 week visit and stayed near Lund in a little town called Staffanstorp where I became very interested in old Swedish windmills (väderkvarn or mölla) and was able to visit over 30 in Skåne. My goal was to visit all of them and I finally accomplished this in 2016! I have a Google map that shows all the locations together with pictures.

My background is Engineering with a BS and MS in Mechanical Engineering and a D. Engr in Agricultural Engineering – all degrees as UCD. I taught at Purdue for 4 years then 2 years at UCD followed by 30 years with Weyerhaeuser R&D ending with the

installation of a production line in a box plant in Yuma, AZ. We have 2 daughter; Amy and Tracy. Amy has a boy and a girl and they live in Spokane. Tracy has two boys, 4 and 7 and they live in Davis about 6 minutes away."


