**Member of the Month.** This month we are featuring **Chris Bodelson.** Chris was born and raised in New York City to a Swedish father (Eric) from Skåne and mother (Karin) whose parents came from Sweden in the early 1900s. Visits to her relatives in Sweden



started early at age two (when she tried to steal a cousin's bicycle). Her family returned again when she was 12, then her aunt, Viola Bodelson, took her on a trip through Sweden and parts on Europe for her high school graduation present, even letting her drive in Sweden (a hair raising experience for everyone as Sweden had just converted to driving on the right a couple of months prior their trip). That was also about the time that her Swenglish started to

get perfected. After her European adventure she resumed her academic endeavors that Fall at the University of Rochester where she met Chuck her second day of her freshman year (he was a sophomore). When she graduated she worked in Manhattan for a year before spending April in Paris. She married Chuck in the Fall of 1974 and moved to San Diego for 9 months as Chuck finished his active duty Navy service.

Chris and Chuck then moved back to Rochester, NY where she earned her BSN, again at the University of Rochester. After her graduation they moved to Portsmouth, NH where Chuck earned his MS while Chris started her nursing career at Portsmouth Hospital, earning the princely sum of \$3.75 an hour!! Chris retired from Kaiser in 2012 and has since filled her time with family travels between Sacramento and Seattle for grandkid visits, lots of theater and choral concert attendance, weekly bridge games, Monitor and Festival activities, reading, gardening, dining out with friends and, of course, the occasional game of solitaire on her iPad.
