Did you know _____ **about Monitor Lodge?** Folks occasionally ask about the different membership categories. While the intimate details can be found in the VASA Constitution, the thumbnail versions follow:

• Active member – 14 years or older individual person initiated into the lodge, able to vote on lodge business and hold elected and appointed office. Pays annual dues and assessments.

- Associate Member 14 years or older individual person whose application has been approved by the lodge but not yet initiated into the lodge, not able to vote on lodge business or hold elected office <u>but</u> can speak at meetings and can hold appointed office. Pays annual dues and assessments.
- **Honorary Life Member** is a VASA member who the local lodge wishes to honor for their service. The person is entitled all active member benefits for life and the local lodge usually pays all their dues and assessments.
- **Honorary Member** any person who is not a member of the local lodge who is worthy of special recognition for personal contributions and support of the local lodge. Is not entitled to any membership privileges.

2019 Dues are due on January 1, 2019. The yearly dues are still \$35.00 <u>per</u> member 14 years of age and older. Dues are delinquent on March 31st. Please make checks payable to Monitor Lodge #218 and mail your dues to:
