**Occasional contemporary Swedish news.** These two news items are extracted from the on-line news source **The Local SE** (<a href="https://www.thelocal.se/">https://www.thelocal.se/</a>):

Sweden introduces new plastic bag tax – A law change introducing a new tax on plastic carrier bags came into force on March  $1^{st}$ . This is meant to reduce rubbish in nature and in the sea, according to an EU directive from 2015 which states that member states are expected to reduce plastic bag usage to 40 per person and year by 2025.





Stockholm's new golden bridge arrive - A new bridge, nicknamed the golden bridge (or *guldbron* in Swedish) due to its golden colour, is set to be installed in central Stockholm, linking the Södermalm island to the capital's Old Town, Gamla Stan. The ongoing and major construction work in the area, which includes a new bus terminal and improved ways of regulating water levels in the capital, is expected to finish in 2025 to the tune of 12.1 billion kronor.
